In my recent travels I visited the pharmacology laboratories of Organon in Oss, Netherlands and met Dr. von Reizen. He has a well equipped neurophysiology center and is specifically studying psychoactive drugs that seem to alter memory processes. Some of his techniques and compounds were new to me.

I found that I described the 1970 Aspen Brain Research meetings with such enthusiasm that he inquired as to the possibility of his attending in 1971. I am writing to ask how this can be arranged. I believe he can make a useful contribution, if asked.

Dick Rech called me in June and we outlined some suggestions for a symposium on drugs, brain function and EEG measures and I trust the program will gel.

What progress has been made on the addiction project? We had great difficulty in obtaining a continued supply of naloxone, and only recently were able to get a firm committment for another year.
