Dear Dr. Nourricier:

For many years I have been interested in the EEG analysis of new psychoactive drugs. Earlier this year, sulphiride was brought to my attention as a compound with clinical psychotropic activity but without the usual pharmacologic profiles. At the CINP in Prague, this interesting discrepancy was confirmed in discussions with Professor P. Simon.

At my request, he has sent me some data from his files, suggesting that I write to you for a more complete record of investigational data. I am interested in the basic pharmacology data and available clinical data as usually supplied to investigators prior to clinical studies. I am writing to ask if such information may be made available to me, as the basis perhaps of a clinical or EEG profile study.

To provide a reasonable background for this request, I am enclosing a copy of my 1969 EEG review which is the basis for our studies.
