RE: MH-11380

I am writing you as project officer for MH-11380 to bring you up-to-date on the present state of the project. As I indicated in October, I will be leaving St. Louis early in June. At that time, the data collection and some of the data analyses will be completed.

There will be funds left in MH-11380 and some recording and analyses can continue under the supervision of Dr. Itil. For this reason I have suggested to the University and am writing to you to recommend that Dr. Itil, the co-investigator of this project, be appointed principal investigator for the duration of the project period.

In November, when I indicated that there may be some funds remaining and that these would be helpful to complete the analyses in New York, I requested that the customary procedures for the handling of grant funds upon relocation of the principal investigator be followed. You may recall that the University suggested an alternate route, that of a subcontract. This seemed agreeable, although novel.

Apparently, the writing of such a contract was novel to the authorities at the University of Missouri and to this date, no such contract has been written. The projected balance for the grant at the termination period, September 30, is estimated between \$8,000 and \$12,000. The Assistant Chairman of the Department has assured me that some of these funds may yet be available during the summer months provided he can complete the necessary legal steps.

Rather than undertake the analyses at the Missouri Institute of Psychiatry installation, I believe that much of the statistical work can be accomplished at Washington University. Dr. Donald Shapiro,

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
