Dear Neil:

I am looking forward to the opportunity to meet with you next week at the Southern AMA Meetings.

The Chairman has asked that I send you a copy of my paper. This cannot be done in the usual fashion since I have been asked to summarize the observations related to EEG changes with psychotropic drugs and their implications for psychiatry. It is my intention to present some of the observations that we have made in the past ten years and discuss the applications of these changes. While much of our recent studies have been devoted to quantification problems, I do not think that this is germane to the interest of this group and so will not devote any time to the computer studies.
