Dear Miss Lightcap:

Thank you very much for your letter of June 26 and the check enclosed. As I described to Dr. Beaver, the Psychiatric Research Foundation is unable to undertake studies on behalf of pharmaceutical laboratories. I indicated that we were interested in including trifluoperidol in a study program which is now in progress and requested some additional grant-in-aid. However, it would be technically helpful to me if both the letter and the check could be rewritten to comply with the regulations of the Foundation. For this reason, I have taken the liberty of editing both, and hope that these corrections can be made in another letter of transmittal.

Would you leave a message for Dr. Beaver to call me on his return to his office, with regard to a letter written to Dr. Gershon by Dr. Seay on March 19, 1964?

We have already received the supply of tablets of trifluoperidol. In preparing our program, it became of interest to us to be able to analyze the EEG effects on the intravenous administration of trifluoperidol. I would be grateful for any information which you may have available regarding the intravenous or parenteral administration of trifluoperidol, the concentration in which it may be available, and whether the present preparation is suitable for intravenous use. If trifluoperidol is available for intravenous use, or if its parenteral form is such as to be considered safe for intravenous use, I would be interested in a small experimental supply.

Thank you for your cooperation.
