I have just read your review in *Contemporary Psychology* of Nahas' volume and wish to congratulate you on an excellent evaluation. When I first read his volume, I was shocked by his bias and relegated the volume to the polemics on my shelves. But, unfortunately, he is verbal and voluble, and appears frequently in New York on school panels, radio and TV. I think he does much harm. Your advice to the reader, to evaluate the work, is excellent.

Our own studies in Greece are finally coming to a conclusion. I am pleased to enclose a copy of the report as submitted to NIDA at the conclusion of the contract. The work is now being prepared for a more conventional, scientific presentation--hopefully, the texts will meet the approval of the various co-authors before the end of the summer.
