Dear Dr. Locke:

I am writing at the request of Mr. Charles Galloway who is applying for a predoctoral traineeship in the Bureau of Child Research.

Mr. Galloway joined the staff of the Missouri Institute of Psychiatry on November 1, 1964, and remained with us for approximately fifteen months. During this time he was a technician in the neurophysiology program. He demonstrated an ability to learn EEG techniques, to utilize the computer equipment available at the Institute and to carry out a number of projects related to experimental psychology. He had an overriding interest in operant conditioning. When it became obvious that the programs at the Institute were not broad enough to support this interest, we encouraged him to apply to the training programs then being established in Kansas City in this field.
