I look forward to seeing you on Thursday morning, and expect to be at Dr. Cohen's office at 9:30 am. As I indicated, one subject for discussion is the possibility of developing a long acting naloxone. However, the principal focus of our meeting should be the possibility of a study at the University of Athens to determine the central nervous system changes, if any, of chronic marijuana use.

I am enclosing copies of the report that I submitted to Dr. Freedman on my return from a visit to Athens on May 8-10, and a memorandum of a proposed project. It was the latter which was the basis of Dr. Freedman's call to Dr. Yolles.
