Dear Dr. Ilyutchenok:

Dr. Bradley and I are pleased to confirm the invitation for your participation in the symposium on Anticholinergic Hallucinogens at the forthcoming meeting of the CINP, to be held in Washington, D.C., on March 29 and 31. We regret that you may be unable to attend the meeting. However, we will be pleased to consider the reading of your report at this meeting and its inclusion in the proposed publication.

As of today, I have not received the book which you have sent me. We are, however, interested in your studies and I would be very grateful if you could send me a copy of your paper and such figures as you may wish to submit. As I will probably accept the responsibility for the reading of your paper, I would be grateful to receive a copy as soon as possible so that I may have the time to ask any questions that may arise.

In the meanwhile, we are interested in printing a program including abstracts for distribution at the meeting and I am requesting that you send me a title for your presentation and a paragraph describing it.

In the event that it would be at all possible for you to attend this meeting, we would be delighted to have you join us.

Five reports will be presented during each three hour session, allowing thirty-five minutes for each presentation and discussion. Since the discussion may be of special interest to the participants, the report should be about twenty minutes in length.

The CINP has permitted us to consider the publication of this symposium separately. Insofar as this subject is becoming increasingly important, we believe that the association of the work of the participants in a single volume will be a valuable contribution, and ask your cooperation in making a manuscript available at the time of the meeting. The manuscripts should be approximately 20 pages of text, plus bibliography and illustrations.
