As we discussed, the Q & A requires some special handling. We would prefer the questions to be set off from the answers, and this may be done by setting the questions in bold face or italic; or the Q and A before each paragraph can be reset in bold face. At the least, there should be additional spacing between each set of Q & A.

Secondly, I was chagrined by the high price charged by the publisher for 100 reprints, and I am enquiring whether a special price can be arrived at for a single order of 100 reprints of each article, paid for by me, in gratitude to each author for his contribution. I would appreciate your response. Alternatively, if reprints were not ordered, but whole issues, what is the price for additional copies to the Editor?
