I very much regret not being able to fly down today. It is the first time I was grounded commercially in years, and I found the experience most frustrating.

Had I been there, I would have told of the availability of the naloxone pamoate, which apparently has been offered by Endo to our laboratories for study; and the tests that should be done with BC 2605 of Bristol; as well as the new findings with 1-alpha acetylmethadol. The latter study is completed and as soon as the report is retyped, I will send you a copy.

I am returning the travel request and other official forms for your files.

Separately, also, I am sending you a copy of the revised proposal for studies in Greece of chronic cannabis users.

Needless to say, I will cooperate with your program for other treatments of opiate dependence-- I hope more successfully than in attending this meeting.
