Dear Max:

My comments are related mainly to clarity of English. Secondly, it seems you are missing your main point - that of a unique subgroup in schizophrenia by this "imipramine disorganization test". That the group is similar after imipramine is interesting, but the fact that they had behavior disorder, early onset, males, ??? - this is the important statement, and should be cast in the context of Don's three reports (including anxiety group).

As for EEG - the statement from the enclosed abstract is correct "for the group" - but you are specifying the data for individual subgroups and here, imipramine effects may be different. My letter of Friday should contribute to this. If you wish to pull out these six pre- and on-drug records, I can either see them in New York this weekend and quantify, or if you send them to St. Louis, I can get the data to you in 48 hours. I suspect these records will show different changes from the other imipramine subjects.
