Dear Milos:

It was very kind of you to send me the program for Hjorth's analysis of EEG. I have given your output to Dr. Shapiro and he has promised to give me a Christmas present of the program. Should it be running, I will obtain these measures in addition to my usual frequency measures in my next drug study and, hopefully, should have some information for the meeting in April.

Should it be possible, I would like to visit your laboratory when I come to Europe in the late spring. I shall probably be accompanied by one of my daughters, and I will use the occasion to see some of the sights of Sweden.
