Dear Dr. Deniker:

The Program Committee of the CIMP requested Philip Bradley and myself to organize a Section on Neuropharmacology. We have elected the subject of anticholinergic hallucinogens and have invited participants from Europe and the United States. The majority have accepted without reservations, but four members have indicated that they will require financial support for their trip. It is not clear to me how the financial arrangements for travel will be handled by CIMP, but at the recent meetings of the ACNP I heard that you would be in charge of the distribution of these funds. If that is correct, we would like your advice as to the proper procedure to follow.

The participants who have requested travel support from Europe to the United States are Dr. S. L. Jenkner of the University of Graz, Austria; Dr. M. Vojtechovsky of Caroline University in Prague, Czechoslovakia, and Mme. J. Verdeaux of Paris. In addition, Dr. V. G. Longo of Rome indicated that he has full travel support to the United States to attend a meeting which will take place ten days prior to the CIMP. He requested some assistance in his support in the United States during that ten day period.

As the time is getting short for these participants to make their plans for the trip in March we would be grateful for your comments regarding the advice we may give these participants, or indeed if we can invite them to be participants.
