Dear Dr. Marsan:

I am pleased to have the opportunity to reprocess the bibliography of EEG and Human Psychopharmacology. I have received from Dr. Bouthilet your critique. During the next few weeks we will make the following corrections:

1. Reset the references according to the EEG Journal style as described January, 1962.
2. Where authors have multiple publications, these will be indexed in chronological order.
3. In such a chronology, where authors appear, the articles will be treated as if they are a new author and will not be listed in the chronology (thus, articles by Fink will be in chronological order; followed by Fink and Kahn in chronological order; followed by Fink, Kahn et al in chronological order).
4. Every effort will be maintained to reproduce the original article title and the journal with accents. However, the translation of the titles will be done by my associates and myself, and I am unable to guarantee the literal nature of these. We will do our best!
5. Regarding abstracts, we have decided that where the article has clearly been published in extenso, the abstract will be deleted. However, I would like to include two abstracts for which no major article has appeared, as these occasionally give data not otherwise available.
6. We shall make a check of the journals for 1962 and bring the listings up-to-date for that year. All publications prior to 1951 have been deleted. The bibliography will then encompass publications listed as 1951-1962 inclusive, with a few references to review articles appearing early in 1963.

These appear to be the principal criticisms, and our responses. We will, of course, review the indices and make as many corrections as possible in the author index. I have in front of me, a list of articles that you kindly sent to Dr. Bouthilet from your own files. It may be advisable for us to review your files, or somebody in your office should check the titles of those articles which we have omitted, so that the bibliography can be as complete as practicable.

I am grateful for your cooperation and look forward to presenting you with a manuscript as soon as possible, for your review, before it is finally typed. Barring unforeseen difficulties, I estimate that we will have this ready within four weeks.
