Dear Eli:

I believe I would like to participate in the supervisory fellowship program of second year medical students, which you described at the Monday luncheon. Except for the week of the APA meetings I expect to be in St. Louis throughout the main portion of the six weeks involved.

I have two study programs in which a student might participate: the comparison of EEG changes in dog and man after psychotropic medication, or a literature review on the effects of hallucinogenic agents on speech patterns. In the first study, I would expect the student will have an opportunity to implant electrodes in at least two dogs and make control observations with two to four standard psychotropic agents. The student should thus obtain some experience in surgery and in electrophysiological recordings. In the second study he would have to delve in a thirty year literature following some specific clues regarding content changes. Thank you for your help.
