I want to thank you for spending so much time with Henk and myself yesterday. I found the visit valuable in helping me to understand the studies which you have done during the past few years.

I read the draft of the report of the studies of ACTH 4-10 on the way home. I think it is straightforward and have two suggestions. On the bottom of Page 1, next to the last line, should read ACTH 4-10 rather than ACTH 1-10; and on Page 3 the method of Experiment 2 should be clearer if the word "intravenous" were added somewhere in the method.

Considering the number of variables which have been tested, is it not possible that the difference in the Benton test might have occurred by chance? Is it not this issue--and, perhaps, an understanding of how it came about--that should be the focus of a succeeding study?

Again, my thanks for the opportunity to visit your laboratory.
