Dear Jovan,

The thiothixene paper has been sent to Current Therapeutic Research, with your corrections. Xerox copies for you, Ali, Ponce and Turan are being sent separately for you to distribute.

I have discussed your appointment with the administration. Since you should come on a full-time basis, I have asked for a higher than usual salary (almost everyone is also in practice) and this has caused some concern. I will call you on Friday in any case.

Cycloserine: The summary of 10/26 is incomplete, insofar as it does not give the dates and "results" of subsequent treatments.

1. For each patient, what dosage did they have, dates and evaluation.

2. Dr. Itil wants to emphasize the relation of blood level to symptom or symptom relief. Would you identify for each patient three periods according to their blood levels: zero to 45 mgm%; 45-65 mgm; greater than 65 mgm%. Then examine the psychopathology scores for affect/mood/emotion; motor; and consciousness/orientation/higher mental function. The question: is there a relation between blood level and the change in these symptoms?

Prolixin: ok

Cyclazocine: ok
