Dear Gerry,

I am enclosing our reports on cyclazocine and naloxone and our pre-rints. The summary of the June 4 meeting is all that is available and will not be published separately. The meeting was a workshop, designed to assess the state of the available knowledge and to chart the needs for further study.

Since the meeting we have:

- 1) Moved Endo (DuPont) to continue to make naloxone available for research;
- 2) Contracted with Food and Drug Research of New York to develop a silastic implant for naloxone;
- 3) obtained M 5050 from England and are filing an IND;
- 4) stimulated a contract application from Alza Inc. for a long acting, non-silastic device for naloxone; and
- 5) set up an unofficial commission, headed by Al Freedman and William Martin to stimulate further study (and seek funds!).

It would be a pleasure to visit you in Boston, and I will call before my next trip. Many thanks for the invitation.
