Dear Dr. Rosenberg:

Since receiving your letter, I was pleased to take the opportunity to discuss your application with a new member of our staff, Dr. Alexander Don, who helped me in formulating the following answers to your questions.

With regard to sponsorship for First Preference visa, I believe that we can do this and would be pleased to do so if the remainder of the credentials appear satisfactory.

Your second question is "would my English training be accepted in America?" It appears to me that your English training would be suitable as a basis for a position at this Institute, and would be suitable for licensure within the State of Missouri on a temporary basis until the remaining requirements (citizenship) are met. If, you are inquiring as to whether your training would be acceptable for certification by the American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology, this is a difficult question and can only be answered by the Board secretary. In general, American Board certification requires full residency within the United States or Canada. However, many capable and well qualified psychiatrists practice in the United States without certification from the American Board.

Your question as to whether you would be given credit for the work you have already done is answered in the affirmative, with regard to this institution.

Since both Dr. Ulett, the Director of the Division of Mental Diseases, and I will be in England during late August, I believe the most expeditious way of handling this application would be for you to make application for an immigrant visa and we would complete the necessary application for First Preference status. I would like to take the liberty of writing to your referees and would be grateful if you would approach Dr. Hill so that we may write to him. I believe we would have a most excellent opportunity to discuss this program with you and to answer your many questions when we visit in England at the end of August. We are looking forward to discussing this further.
