Dear Neil:

It was a great pleasure to watch you operate in your inimitable analog style. I think that the meeting went well, and I look forward to continuing our collaboration.

I am not at all clear as to which of the many suggested protocols would be satisfactory to you. A collaboration through the transfer of tapes would probably work. However, it seems to me that a more efficient operation would be for both of us to have similar analog equipment.

At the present time, I own two Ulett-Loeffel analyzers. They are fairly well matched and the electronic specialist who did most of the work in building both units is on my staff. He could easily package one of these and ship it to you.

The original cost of one of these instruments is between \$10-11,000. I have no idea what its net worth is today.

In exchange, would it be possible for you to make available a period analyzer?

In this way, we could both have similar equipment and obtain comparative data. The availability of this equipment should also make possible more extensive comparisons between the analog and the digital analysis.
