Thank you for the careful editing of my contribution to the EEG special issue. I accept each of your suggestions and make the following amendments.

pg 6, par. 3: Replace sentence 1 with:

In the past ten years, approximately 70 new chemical entities have been studied by quantitative EEG methods (Table III).

pg 8 and others: I have checked the dosage schedule as reported by Itil in a number of reports and the proper dosages are 20 to 300 milligrams orally given; and 500, 600, 1000 and 1200 micrograms. Please correct the text using the proper symbols for the measures.

Also, page 8, line 6 should be corrected to read:

With TRH, Itil (1974a) and Itil and his co-workers (1974a, 1975) report . . .

Table 2: The correction can be made by adding to the top of the table, the following phrase, centered under the heading:

(As defined in Table I)

Reference # 1. Abuzzahab. The correct citation is American Journal of Clinical Research 1:9-15, 1970.

page 15: The only date on the volume by Matecjek and Schenk is 1975.

page 16: Blackman and Tukey (1958) is correct.

Citations: Deleted the citation by Irwin and Fink (1975) from the citation list. The sentence above, page 8, corrects the other errors.
