Dear Irv:

For a number of years I have been unhappy with the performance of Mildred Hill on my service. Early this year, her absentee record was so bad, and her performance when available so contrary to the aims of the program that I discussed her performance with her. I received no satisfaction and then referred the matter to you.

You suggested that I speak to Mr. Torres, which I did do; and he assured me that he would have her reassigned to another division, if indeed he was unable to discharge her.

In checking on the letter from the Attorney General, I was told by two members of the staff that Miss Hill still is involved with our outpatients; that her attitudes are still referred to as contrary to our program goals; and that she has been known to voice public concern with our experimental programs.

Without going into the merit of her competence as a counselor (a competence that has not been demonstrated in 5 years of association), I do believe that her attitude to research problems is detrimental to the successful completion of our projects; and on this basis, again request that she be separated from my service, completely and immediately, for the good of the service.
