Dear Dr. Bird:

The EEG studies of cyclazocine are, as yet, incomplete and I am continuing the investigations in New York. I have shipped the remaining cyclazocine to New York and it is now in transit. Rather than return this supply, I would suggest you change your records to indicate that the same study is continuing at the New York Medical College - Metropolitan Hospital Center. The reports will be made available at the conclusion of the study when we will summarize our observations.

The EEG changes are definite and in comparison to the usual classes of psychotropic and centrally active drugs, sufficiently unique to warrant reporting. As soon as I have enough data to summarize, I will be pleased to send you a copy.

I trust we can continue this study in this new location.
