I missed you in Madrid but as some of the other V's will tell you, I did spend some time with your compatriots and enjoyed every minute of it. The meetings were very good and it was an important complement to my visit to Moscow and Leningrad.

I have been in New York for three months now and I am very pleased with the changes in my unit. Of course, I have to re-establish the clinical facilities and the laboratories that I had in Missouri. But, this is going well and I hope to be productive again in less than a year.

I have received your last letter with the cycloserine notes. As you know, I brought the cycloserine from St. Louis to New York but will not undertake any studies until Dr. Simeon joins me early next year.

I have also received your kind invitation and will see if the visit is possible, and will let you know before the end of October.

When you last visited you expressed an interest in having some American journals. My own subscriptions are relatively few since I have dedicated most of my journal funds to the Institution Library. I have, however, picked up some journals during the past few months and separately I am sending you copies of Psychological Abstracts, Neurology and the American Journal of Psychiatry. As these come in I will have my secretary ship them to you and I hope that they will be helpful.
