Dear Paddy,

It was nice talking to you and I am pleased to enclose some reprints of our work with narcotic antagonists. I have been impressed that the antagonist model is a most useful one for the treatment of addiction and have been encouraged to continue this area of study. If you have the opportunity to treat some narcotic addicts, in addition to treating some with methadone, you might consider treating others with cyclazocine. This can be obtained on an experimental basis from Dr. Joseph G. Bird, Sterling-Winthrop Research Institute, Rensselaer, New York 12144.

Unfortunately, I have no experience with the treatment of methedrine addiction, but will probably begin with fluphenazine, in high doses.
