Dear Irene,

Thank you for the inquiry about a conference on phenothiazines. As you know, my primary interest is in the neurophysiology of compounds, and not their chemistry, so I have not had much of direct interest to contribute to earlier conferences. Nevertheless, I think such a conference should be held, preferably in 1971 (late), in Europe, preferably in England where much of the work seems to be progressing rapidly.

As is generally experienced in many conferences, a small meeting of 40-60 participants and an additional 30-50 observers seems to be the most useful.

The theme of the meeting should decide on the participants, and surely the leaders of the last meeting may be the best to assess the relevant interesting topics.
