Dear Philip,

I am pleased with the outcome of your discussions with Dr. Remarque, endorse the publication of the proceedings as a volume in PRB, and agree with the procedures which you have outlined for the manuscripts. Separately, the originals of the manuscripts with their figures and my comments will be sent to you within a week, so that those articles in my hands should be in England by the end of the month.

I am pleased to write a summary discussion and shall attend to it immediately. The draft should be in your hands soon after I have sent the manuscripts.

You should write to Drs. Longo, Votava, Wikler, Jacobsen and Jasper. Since Votava is in a neighboring state and had promised to send me a copy, I may call him if I do not receive a manuscript within a reasonable time.

Your suggestion that Wikler's report may provide an introduction may be satisfactory, but I would like to withhold final judgment until we have had a chance to see the tenor of his remarks.

The sequence of documents, the handling of proofs, indexing, etc. are details that should await their proper time.

I look forward to collaboration in this venture.
