Dear Prof. Vossenaar,

I very much enjoyed my visits to Oss and to London, and take this occasion to congratulate you and your staff for having achieved so much in so little time. It was rewarding to find that the complete data analytic system was in operation; to find that the data recording system was well thought out and should be operational within a few months in London; and to have an opportunity to discuss a series of novel and interesting compounds, as GB-94, OI-63, OI-30 and the many others in the 'pipe-line'.

In my visit to London, I was impressed by Prof. Lange and his technician, his facilities, and his caution and judgement. I believe I can work well with him, and we will cooperate in setting up his facility. As soon as he is ready, we will carry out parallel studies of GB-94.

We are continuing our increasing dose studies of OI-63. I also have met with Dr. Joyce Small and discussed with her, studies of OI-63 (a replication in man of the memory studies of van Riezen) and of GB-94 (rapid dose increases in a few days in patients who have been recommended for ECT). I believe she is interested in both studies, and has agreed to write to Dr. van Riezen.

I have sent the sample of OI-30 to Dr. William Martin at our national narcotic addiction research center in Lexington, Kentucky.

I should be remiss if I didn't express my sincere thanks to Drs. Giles, van Riezen, Porzack and their associates, for making my visit so fruitful for me and so comfortable. While they kept me busy, I enjoyed every minute, and returned to New York, somewhat tired, but most enthused. I look forward to another visit and the results of the ongoing studies.
