I want to thank you for your courtesy and patience in explaining the operation of your IBM 1800 system, and particularly your use of that system for data acquisition and processing. It was kind of you to take the time from your busy schedule, and I am most grateful.

Perhaps, I did not express my enthusiasm for your observation of very fast frequencies in the EEG. When Turan and I looked at fast frequencies, we looked at 80-150 cps, and in one study, of the effects of pentothal, we found interesting frequency changes, but these were not unique to the fast bands, and we were not sure that we were not dealing with artefacts. Your focus on truly fast frequencies is most interesting and I look forward to the report and the responses at the EEG meetings this fall.
