Dear Dr. Marsan:

First, let me thank you for your cooperation and your many kindnesses during Mrs. Brown's visit. Again, we have made some decisions following your recommendations and I will send you a sample "introduction" within the next ten days.

Meanwhile, I am enclosing some IBM cards and a print-out. Rather than have the secretaries type the many pages of the references, it will be easier to have these punched on IBM cards. Once punched, they are easily verified and corrected. Listings are readily made. When the bibliography appears, we can make the cards (or a tape) available to those readers who have IBM equipment and can pay the cost of reproduction.

However, the references going to the printer will have to be in the attached type format. There is only one case. There is no underlining possible. (We can do this by hand for the printer.) We can, also, either use a (-) to indicate words completed in the next line; or have no incomplete words; or omit the (-) sign at the end of the line. Some characters are absent, i.e., quotation marks, colon, semicolon, ampersand.
