Dear Mrs. Green:

Enclosed is a preprint of a report which has recently appeared in the J.A.M.A. and which describes the present status of cyclazocine treatment. In addition, I am taking the liberty of enclosing a preprint of another report which describes the general philosophy of antagonists in the treatment of narcotic addiction somewhat more fully, although it is based on the same data.

Cyclazocine is an experimental compound and is not available except in research centers. It is given both orally and parenterally. The dosages are indicated in the report. At the present time cyclazocine has not been approved by the Food and Drug Administration of the United States.

In the event that responsible medical offices are interested in exploring the additional uses of this compound please ask them to write to me.
