Enclosed are three checks following your request:

I have also paid Dr. Liakos directly the sum of \$1,600, representing the salary due him; and sent Costas Miras \$1,666, representing his consulting and laboratory expenses to 6/30/73.

I am enclosing an updated work-sheet which indicates that \$41,480 remain unspent to December 31, 1973. You will note that I have allocated some of your requests to arbitrary categories, to fit some of the contract allocations. Please note that the categories are flexible, and all the sums are available in any category (except travel and hospitalization which are restricted to the amounts allocated).

Dr. Liakos is working hard. He has spent one week with my associates in New York and three days here in Stony Brook; he has learned how to read and use the regression programs, and is now designing analyses of his own, which we plan to do at the end of this week.

As I indicated on the telephone, I have received 300 grams Nepalese hashish from NIMH, but cannot obtain a legal export license since the import certificate that I submitted was considered outdated. I will ask Dr. Liakos if he will take the material; if not, I will try to bring it at the end of August.

I will give Dr. Liakos the additional chromosomal material, and should have some answers to the publication problem.
