Dear Jiri,

Enclosed is a letter I sent some weeks ago, which was returned. From Voita, I have obtained this address and I trust this letter will reach you.

The work in the laboratory is progressing very well, and for many studies we are now in the data analysis phase of our program. Voita has reviewed the EEG data of the ECT study, and we have asked that the records be analyzed by computer to give us better estimates of the delta activity and the difference between the two sides of the head.

I have also asked Voita to complete the methadone data and he has suggested that this too should have computer analysis. I have asked him to outline the work that should be done, and if we can do it (and I am sure we can) the records will be analyzed this summer.

Al Freedman and I have organized a special meeting of specialists in opiate antagonists on Thursday. We hope to stimulate more interest in a long acting antagonist. Al has received a special contract to develop such a compound and we hope to stimulate some company to carry out the chemistry studies.

Kathy has married, and will continue to work as long as she is able. Stanley and Voita have developed a good program for the analysis of heroin effects and I have sent their project to NIMH for support. We have sufficient funds to begin the study on our own this fall and I propose to do so, if only to get a head start on the project.

If all goes well, I plan to take my children and Martha with me to Prague for the CINP this August, and to Istanbul for their (the Turkish CINP) meeting. Perhaps we will be able to meet somewhere in Europe, for all my girls would be pleased, as would I.
