Dear Dieter:

At the last CINP meeting in Munich, the group of electroencephalographers decided to hold an all day symposium in Birmingham in conjunction with the CINP meeting. As you may recall, Borenstein (Paris) and I were asked to make the arrangements for this meeting on EEG and Human Psychopharmacology. We spoke to Dr. Bradley and he agreed to help us set up this meeting.

A few weeks ago, I heard from Fritz Freyhan that you were chairman of the Program Committee and that the 1964 meeting would be devoted to working groups on a variety of subjects.

We would prefer to have the EEG meeting as part of the CINP and not before or after the meetings. Is this possible? Would the Executive Council consider EEG and Human Psychopharmacology as one of the working groups?

The American College of Neuropsychopharmacology has established such a working committee, of which Dr. James Toman of Chicago and I are co-chairmen. We have already held two meetings and a third will be held in October.

These last few months have been spent in establishing our laboratories and in working with our group of patients. Turan and I are now measuring the pentothal response in these subjects. It has been a real pleasure to have Turan work with us. I hope that by next summer we will have some fine results to present, and to discuss with you.
