Dear Harold:

It has been a few weeks since I visited you in your laboratories and have had the opportunity to discuss my observations with my associate, Dr. Itil.

I would like to enter two separate orders with your laboratories and should like to receive a specific quotation and a probably delivery date for each. Insofar as the details may not be clear from this letter, would you please call me so that we can discuss the details before the actual order is written.

One unit will be a telemetry data acquisition system. For this, we would like to be able to transmit a single channel of EEG from a patient and to record this either on a Grass Model VI electroencephalograph or concurrently on an Ampex SP 300 tape recorder. For these purposes, I believe we will need an FM transmitter (Model 601) and receiver (602). From the description of the transmitter, I believe an EEG amplifier (611) will be necessary.

We would be grateful for the quotation of a single amplifier system. In addition, the descriptions provide that the addition of a subcarrier oscillator and discriminator may make possible two channel operation. If this is so, we would be grateful for a second quotation for such two channel operation including two EEG amplifiers. (Model 611).

Secondly, we would like to order an EEG period analysis and digital datalogging system. Much as described in your letter of August. However, in my discussion with you there were a number of modifications and omissions from that original description which seemed to follow from my special needs.

I would be grateful if you would provide a specific modification of that price breakdown so that we can enter such an order. As I recollect, we will delete one spectral computer (Minor Period), Model 102C, and will add a device for the integration of amplitude of the signal. Also, we were not interested in a paper tape punch or in a digital display, but were anxious for the incremental digital magnetic tape recorder. Incidentally, your price list did not include the cost of a time code generator (Model 802). While this does not appear necessary for this system, Dr. Itil and I are interested in providing a better relationship between our paper records and magnetic tapes.

Thank you very much for your time during my recent visit.
