One of my associates has re-read the manuscript and has made a number of minor criticisms which I would like to accept. In the event the report "Trifluoperidol and the Treatment of Psychosis" has not yet gone to the printer, would you please replace page one and have your assistant make the following minor corrections in the text:

Paragraph 2, Line 4	parkinson drugs (instead of cholinergic drugs)
Page 7	not occur in our patients, in contrast to other reports (30, 33). (instead of "not occur in our patients, in contrast to the report of Warnes, Lee and Ban, (33) who noted a 70% incidence in their study.)
Page 8, Table II	The number receiving drug, 1-6 mg, should be 19 (instead of 22).
Reference 1, Line 2	tioproperazina (instead of triproperazina)
Reference 6, Line 2	terapia (instead of perapia)
Reference 18, Line 1	Haase, H. J. (instead of Haase, E. J.)
Reference 26, Line 1	O'Regan, J. B. (instead of O'Reagan, J. B.)

I regret that these errors were made, but I hope that it may be possible to make the corrections before this has gone to galley.
