Dear Mrs. Allyn:

Thank you for your letter of February 1, 1966. We have considered both itineraries and would like to make arrangements for the second itinerary with some modifications.

The connection New York-Paris-Moscow is satisfactory.

The connection Moscow-Leningrad-Moscow is also agreeable, except that we are not sure that we would like to take the train in both directions. Is there a flight leaving Leningrad on the afternoon of August 13 which can take us to Moscow and then to Istanbul? In your other itinerary you have suggested a flight Moscow-Vienna-Istanbul leaving Moscow at 9:25 a.m. Is there any flight from Leningrad which can arrive in Moscow that morning to make this connection on August 14?

Our second question relates to a stopover in Budapest. Is this necessary or can the connection be made that day as on August 10, going directly Moscow-Vienna-Istanbul?

The return to New York will be from Rome on a direct flight after 21 days. Can this be done on August 24?

I would appreciate your making the necessary arrangements in Moscow and the appropriate hotel reservations in Leningrad as well. In our travels we prefer not to have our meals at the hotel, and will require a double-bedded room and a single for my son.

In Paris, we would like reservations at the airport hotel for the night of August 4. We will consider hotel accommodations in Istanbul and Rome later.

Considering the dates involved, we would appreciate your reserving travel space and the accommodations in Russia as soon as practicable.
