Thank you very much for your kind invitation to amplify on our experiences with LSD. My associates and I, being painfully aware of the need for better documentation of the problems of LSD experimentation, prepared the report which you read in the *Archives of General Psychiatry*. It represents the best we could extract from the available data. Unfortunately, the study of LSD has been a side issue for us and we have not paid as close attention to the personality aspects of all our patients as we did in those who had complications. For this reason, it would be difficult to write a scientific report of some merit since almost all the data that we have is already published.

We must decline, therefore, your kind invitation, and trust that we will have more rigorous information of interest to you at a later date.
