Dear Jonathan:

Attached are work sheets which represent various budgets for the supplementary request MH-11380-01-S1. The budget is in two parts, representing the continuation of the computer studies of EEG for the remainder of the grant period (18 months), and our participation in the Collaborative Schizophrenia Study.

The portion representing the computer analysis will permit us to pay Mr. Don Shapiro at a new salary rate which will become effective upon his being awarded the D.Sc degree from Washington University. The salary differential is that which the University would pay him as a member of their faculty.

The supplement also will pay for a continuation of our contract with Washington University for consultation and IBM 7072 computer time. Also, we are asking for additional funds to rent a high speed printer which will permit us to be on-line for our analyses during the final year of this grant. These three portions, salary differential for Mr. Shapiro, consultation with Washington University, and rental of a high speed printer, will make possible the analyses which were projected in the original grant application.

The portion marked "B" represents the Collaborative Study. I have reviewed my work load for the next six to eight months and find it very heavy. If you wish to have this supplementary study done, we will do everything possible to accomplish it. However, in view of my commitments, I would deem it a great advantage to my programs if we did not undertake this study this year.

I trust that the remainder of this budget is clear.
