For the past half year, we have been pre-occupied with our EEG assessments in a variety of studies, each designed to define useful techniques. Preprints are enclosed, as these studies have not yet been published, and will serve to describe the state of our art.

For two studies, comparable data from other investigators are now available. Pfeiffer and Goldstein assessed S 42,548 in volunteers using their amplitude integration techniques; and Dement and Kales each evaluated GP 41299 in separate sleep studies. If these may be useful to you, I will send you copies.

Again, my thanks for your patients and interest in the EEG techniques of drug classification.
