Dear Dr. Bures:

Dr. Bradley and I are pleased to confirm the invitation for your participation in the symposium on Anticholinergic Hallucinogens at the forthcoming meeting of the CINP, to be held in Washington, D.C. on March 29 and 31. We look forward to the presentation entitled "The Effect of Physostigmine and Atropine on Conditioned and Unconditioned Behavior of Rats." As there are still a few questions about the ability of some of the European invitees to attend the meeting, it will be a few weeks before we can send a definitive program and time schedule.

Five reports will be presented during each three hour session, allowing thirty-five minutes for each presentation and discussion. Since the discussion may be of special interest to the participants, the report should be about 20 minutes in length.

The CINP has permitted us to consider the publication of this symposium separately. Insofar as this subject is becoming increasingly important, we believe that the association of the work of the participants in a single volume will be a valuable contribution, and ask your cooperation in making a manuscript available at the time of the meeting. The manuscript should be approximately 20 pages of text, plus bibliography and illustrations.
