Dear Neil:

I am enclosing a copy of the operating manual for the EEG analyzer plus a set of drawings. I should like you to check these and if they meet with your approval, I shall arrange to ship the instrument to you.

I should like a letter from you agreeing to an exchange of instruments and your recommendations regarding whether you wish to consider this a transfer of property at a nominal fee of \$1.00, or a loan with the right to the equipment to remain at each institution. I would prefer an outright exchange as that would then permit each of us to make such equipment modifications as we wish with impunity.

I would like to make available to you the services of our technician for a day or two in setting up this equipment. In like fashion, I would be grateful if one of your staff could come to St. Louis with your equipment and help me set it up. If this exchange of staff is agreeable, I should be pleased to defray all shipping costs plus the travel expenses of my technician if you will do likewise.

Since I believe we are through with the present Mnetron equipment, I would be grateful if you would have your recorder and its parts and the original EEG records returned to St. Louis. I should like to use the recorder for some physiological recording

in the pharmacology laboratory.

My sound room will be completed by next week, and at that time we will move the whole EEG laboratory to the computer floor. By the end of the year, I should have an integrated operation and would be delighted to concurrently test the analog and digital methods of period analysis.
