Dear Prof. Fukuda,

I am honored by your kind invitation to participate in the symposium on schizophrenic psychoses in Kyoto on September.8. I regret that I am unable to accept this invitation, as I will be giving a lecture at the International EEG meetings in Amsterdam at that time. I also regret that I shall not be able to attend the World Congress meetings in Hawaii as it is impractical to be in Hawaii and Europe at the same time.
