It was indeed a pleasure to hear from you. Alice and Martin joined my family skiing in Vale. We had a fine time. Even Alice got on skis, and considering her phobic anxiety about any harm that may come to her ankles, her willingness to try was symbolic either of a reduction in fear, or an assumption that her dancing was less important now than it had been these many years.

At the present time SUNY at Stony Brook does not have its own hospital and is dependent on the clinical faculties of the V.A. Hospital, Meadowbrook, Long Island Jewish Hospital, and Central Islip. I do not think the opportunity for a part-time position at the university is too good. My expectation is that within a few years, when the clinical center at the university is finally completed, clinical funds will be available and a faculty, both part-time and full-time will both be appointed.
