Dear Jon:

Should you wish to expand your program to include EEG measures, we are pleased to cooperate and analyze the tapes using our IBM 1800 system. Our present recorder is a Hewlett Packard 3960 A (1 7/8, 3 3/4, 7 1/2 IPS, 4 track, 1/4 inch, FM) and your lab should have a compatible recording system.

In addition, it is useful to have a sine wave oscillator (similar to H.P. 202CC) and an oscilloscope monitor. We "charge" users according to the hours of computer time for EEG analysis and for such statistical analyses as are required. For the usual studies you might complete in a year, \$4,000 should be very adequate.

Finally, should you need a new EEG, we have found the Grass polygraph with 7P511 amplifiers stable and most satisfactory. For a 4-channel portable the cost is about \$4,000; and an 8-channel about \$8,000.

We would be pleased to cooperate with your laboratory.
