Despite the outcome, I wish to thank you for the efforts you have made in presenting our point of view to your associates. It is difficult to accept the proposition that there is a clear relation between brain function and behavior. I hope that the data we are now presenting serves to change the general point of view, that the EEG is a useless instrument, and that more applications will be made, particularly in psychopharmacology.

You should know that we have already begun our initial survey, and failed to find a clear profile at 25 mg chlordiazepoxide, but the changes at 50 mg are consistent.

Your participation in such a study will always be welcome, and I trust that you will come and visit at your earliest opportunity.
