Dear Philip,

Between your last letter and today I have received some changes in titles, which, with your notes has resulted in the recommendation of the following clustering of the papers.

I am not sure of the participation of Drs. Jenkner and Vojtechovsky. From my discussions with Jonathan Cole, the recommendations have gone to Paris but as of today we are not assured of any support. For this reason I have included four probable participants and a fifth on the assumption that the fifth may not be available.

I see little choice but to be prepared just before the meeting to issue a revised bulletin if that is necessary.

Most of the participants have responded to the invitations with agreement. Dr. Longo, however, was strong in his feeling that a summary of our proceedings should not be published. We will have the opportunity to discuss this in Washington and make our decision at that time.

Since some of the participants have asked for copies of the program, I am sending one of the enclosed to each of the invited guests.

Do you think it would be helpful for the participants to meet before the session, either at breakfast on Tuesday morning or in a room Monday night?
