Dear Dr. Klinman:

Your letter to Dr. Freedman has been sent to me for reply. The Department of Psychiatry is rapidly expanding and I believe that opportunities both for you and your wife exist in this program. Among the more rapid growing parts of the Department are the units for partial hospitalization, a rapid treatment unit and a study program in narcotic addiction.

Fortuitously, there is a special opportunity for your wife, insofar as the present chief of the Division of Psychology is stepping down from that position to devote more of his time to a research program in rapid treatment.

In the expansion of these programs, emphasis is given to the evaluation of the treatment and to the study designs which may make this possible. To minimize the variability inherent in a large staff on a very part time basis the appointments to the Department since last summer have largely been made on a full time basis and only on occasion at three-quarter or half-time.

I would be pleased to have an opportunity to meet with both of you and to discuss the programs of the Department. Is it possible for you to visit New York? If so, would you care to call my office at 212 369-7900 Ext. 248 and arrange for a suitable time.
