Dear Mr. Greathouse,

I am not aware of a pharmaco-EEG bioequivalence study for thioridazine. It is possible that Professor Itil of the New York Medical College in Valhalla carried out such a study. Our own studies have been dedicated to a range of other psychoactive substances, and I enclose recent summaries of our experience.

Peter Irwin was a leader in these projects in my laboratory. He joined the Sandoz professional staff about five years ago and is in your East Hanover facility. Should you want direct information on our experience, I am confident that he is able to answer your questions with as much security as I could.

These studies were done with single channel EEG processing. In the past year, we set up two EEG laboratories with multi-lead EEG recording systems with simultaneous processing of 4 to 16 channels of EEG in real time.
